A Summary of Actions of the Randolph Field ISD Board of Trustees

Meeting of February 22, 2007

Calendar is Approved

Trustees officially adopted the new calendar for the 2007-2008 school year. New teacher inservice will be held Aug. 15-17 with all teaching staff reporting back for inservice on Aug. 20 through Aug. 23. Aug. 24 will be a teacher preparation day, and students will report on Aug. 27 for the first day of school. The last teaching day of the school year will be June 4, followed by a teacher preparation day on June 5. Holidays will be Sept. 3, Labor Day; Oct. 8, Columbus Day (students only—staff development day); Nov. 12, Veteran's Day; Nov. 19-21, staff development days/student holidays; Nov. 22-23, teacher/student holidays; Dec. 24-Jan. 4, teacher/student holidays; Jan. 18, teacher preparations/student holiday; Jan. 21, MLK Day, teacher/student holiday; Feb. 18, President's Day teacher/student holiday; Mar. 17-21, Spring Break teacher/student holiday; Apr. 25, Battle of Flowers teacher/student holiday; May 26, Memorial Day, teacher/student holiday. Bad weather make-up days will be Feb. 18 and May 26, if necessary. Six week periods will be Aug. 27-Oct. 5; Oct. 9-Nov. 16; Nov. 26-Jan. 17; Jan. 22-Mar. 7; Mar. 10-Apr. 24; and April 28-June 4.

Construction Contract Okayed

The Board of Trustees approved a \$2,354,000 bid proposal from J.C. Stoddard Construction for renovation work at Randolph Elementary School. The project includes a covered play area, canopies, parking lot, student drop-off zone, sidewalk work and drainage improvements.

Summer Hours Set

Summer hours for the district's Administrative Offices were set by trustees. Beginning June 4 and extending through Aug. 10 the offices will be opened Monday through Thursday from 7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Offices will be closed on Friday and also on July 4 in observance of Independence Day.

Administrative Contracts Approved

The Board approved contract extensions for district administrative personnel including principals, secondary associate principal, elementary vice principal, athletic director, math facilitator and executive directors of instructional services; finance and support services and technology.

Trustees and officers of the Universal City Veterans of Foreign Wars honored three Randolph High School students for finishing first, second and third in the annual Voice of Democracy essay competition.
