A Summary of Actions of the Randolph Field ISD Board of Trustees

Meeting of December 6, 2007

New Board Member Seated, Officers Elected

Maj. Michael Love was sworn into his first term as a Board member, replacing Gene Quintanilla who was honored for his service. Quintanilla was presented a memento of his service on the Board by his fellow trustees. The Board then reorganized its slate of officers. Sharon Holland was elected to another term as president, while John McKinley will serve as vice president and Jonathan Poole as secretary.

District Textbook Committee Named

Thirteen staff members have been named to the RFISD's Textbook Committee that will review the adoption of k-5 mathematics textbooks. Elementary school teachers are Edie Gross, Deborah Wells, Sue Wieser, Colleen Aniol, Tess Gooden, Phyllis McCullough, Michelle Wagner, Beth Zipp, Frank Rigsby and Bridget Brennan-Bergman. Administrative staff members on the committee are Billy Walker, Rita Polen and Susan Bendele.

Policy Updates Approved

Trustees also approved two updates to district policies, as recommended by the Texas Association of School Boards. The updates make district policies consistent with changes made by the previous two sessions of the Texas Legislature.

Exit Level TAKS Results Reviewed

Board members were presented the results of the October exit level TAKS scores for students who had previously not passed one or more sections of the test as well as those students new to the state who had never taken the test. In all, 14 tests were administered and only two were not passed. All 11 English tests were passed, while 9 of 10 math tests were passed. In social studies all nine tests taken were passed, and in science 11 of 12 tests taken passed. Remediation will be offered to those who still have sections of the TAKS to pass.

TEA Honors Are Received

Trustees were informed that the Texas Education Agency has awarded the RFISD 22 Gold Performance awards for high performances in academic areas critical to the success of students. The awards were presented the elementary, middle and high school levels.
