A Summary of Actions of the Randolph Field ISD Board of Trustees

Meeting of May 25, 2006

Retiring Teachers Honored

Four Randolph Field ISD veteran teachers who are retiring at the end of the school year were honored by Trustees. In recognition of their distinguished service, each was presented with a Waterford crystal "Randolph Star." The retirees are Robin Davidson, high school English teacher; Martha Rouse, high school English teacher; Alice Voigt, high school P.E. and athletics, and Linda Matusky, district payroll director. Davidson has been in education for 40 years; Rouse, 20 years; Voigt, 29 years and Matusky, 27 years.

State Champions Recognized

Also recognized by the Board were state champion girls track team members and the boys track team members who participated at the State Meet. The girls' 1600 meter relay team consisting of Tamoya Morrison, Jenada Morrison, Jenovia Morrison and Jayla McArthur, won a first place gold medal, and the 800 meter relay team comprised of the same four athletes won a second place silver medal. In addition McArthur won second place in the 1200 meters, while Leah Solomon finished sixth in the 100 meters. Coaching the girls was Misty Kinsey.

Also honored were boys' track team members who finished 12th in the state. They included Zach Collins, fifth in the 100 meters; Sean Applewhite, fifth in the 100 meters, and the 1600 meter relay team that finished in fourth place. The team consisted of Applewhite, Randy Mitchell, Nick Carraway and Jake Owen. Coaching the boys was Mike Kinsey.

Contract Procedure Okayed.

Trustees approved the use of the competitive sealed proposal method for awarding a contract for a planned renovation project at Randolph Elementary School. The exterior renovation project provides for improved drainage, construction of safe student drop-off zones, canopies and playground area improvements. When bids are received, they will be reviewed by an evaluation committee, and award will be based on the best value to the district.

Other actions

In other actions, trustees:

- Reviewed results of testing programs including The Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System and TAKS, Grades 3-11.
- Authorized disposal of designated salvage/surplus property at a date as yet to be determined. The property includes computer equipment as well as some office furniture.
