Explanation of Adequately Yearly Progress:

The *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB)* was signed by President George W. Bush on January 8, 2002. Under NCLB, all school districts, campuses and the state are evaluated annually for Adequate Yearly Progress.

All students in grades 3-8 and 10 must be tested and all results included in AYP. Assessments evaluated for AYP are:

- Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) in Reading/English Language Arts and Mathematics;
- Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills-Modified (TAKS-M) in Reading/English Language Arts and Mathematics for students receiving special education services who meet participation requirements for TAKS-M and for whom TAKS is not appropriate;
- Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills-Alternate (TAKS-Alt) in Reading/English Language Arts and Mathematics for students with significant cognitive disabilities who meet the participation requirements;
- Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS) Reading for recent immigrant limited English proficient (LEP) students who were exempted in Reading/English Language Arts by the Language Proficiency Assessment

Committee (LPAC);

- Linguistically Accommodated Testing (LAT) of the TAKS and TAKS-M Reading/English Language Arts and Mathematics assessments for recent immigrant LEP students who were exempted by the LPAC.

Districts and campuses must meet test participation standards as well as standards for students tested. All students, and African American, Hispanic, White, economically disadvantaged, special education, and LEP student groups must meet the same performance and participation standards. High schools must meet a Graduation Rate standard and elementary and middle schools must meet attendance standards as determined by the state of Texas.

The AYP performance standards are:

- Reading/English Language Arts           80% or better
- Mathematics                                   75% or better

The AYP participation standard is 95% participation on the reading/English Language Arts tests and on the mathematics tests.

The Graduation Rate for the district and the high school is 75% or better, and the Attendance Rate for the middle school and the elementary is 90% or better.
